With reference to our donation to the University in 2018 he informed the members that £1200 had been given for 2 travel scholarships as suggested by the University. One recipient, Lucy, a Chemistry student had visited Fukushima as part of the Fukushima Youth Ambassadors Programme. The other recipient, Miriam is a Politics student currently studying for a year at the University of Sydney.

Hamish Macdonald agreed to join the Committee.

Possible College Lunch

Although no progress has been made to date it was felt by all that this would be worthwhile. Bob McLatchie said that he could be a link with St Cross College and John said he would try the Development Office again for suggestions of possible speakers.

Possible visit to Tom Brown's School Museum Uffington

This would be a summer visit, possibly on a Sunday when members could avail themselves of the Cream Teas on offer in the local Church.

Possible visit to Diamond Light Source, Harwell

If there are sufficient numbers it may be feasible to arrange a private visit. This suggestion was met with wide approval.

Membership Fees

It was suggested to the members the subscription should be increased to £20 per annum. Most members having already paid for this year would not be affected until the 2020 subscription. It is not the Society's policy to withdraw membership from anyone who fails to amend their Standing Order and on this understanding the members agreed to the increase.

Recruitment

In the light of declining membership numbers some time was spent in discussion of ways to encourage new members and several suggestions were made. Hamish Macdonald thought it may be possible for information about OSGUG to be included in, for example, the financial /funding communications from the Funding Authorities which all Alumni receive on a regular basis. Jackie Hruby mentioned that an email drive may bring some worthwhile results. It was felt that these suggestions would be worth exploring.

Future Donations to the University

There was further discussion regarding the current Travel Scholarships where members expressed some disappointment at the lack of detailed information received from the University. Some members felt that they would like to support students who were experiencing hardship in the pursuit of their studies. Other suggestions were sponsorship for a PhD student or for a particular subject area, the latter to be rotated on a regular basis. It was agreed that perhaps for the current year Travel Scholarships would be the most convenient way to go. Ken agreed to contact the Development Office to ascertain further possibilities for the future.

Rosemary Macdonald told members of a recent meeting in London where Professor Frank Coton spoke about the proposed Learning Hub and the ways in which teaching and learning are being shaped by technology. Information is available online.
